50th Anniversary Celebration

We wish you could have joined us in August to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Miraflores Cochapamba church. Food, choral contests, competitive sports, worship and fellowship filled the week-long celebration.

Fifty-two years ago, the Kichwa people were liberated from servitude, granted citizenship, and given land. The freedom to make their own decisions marked the beginning of revival and eventually the start of many Kichwa churches. During this time, many Kichwa pastors and church leaders sacrificed their lives.

Twenty years ago, the Miraflores Cochapamba leaders requested help building a water system for the 114 homes in that community. Providentially, the Lord provided funds and helped us conquer extremely difficult technical, social, and legal issues. Crystal clean spring water flows at the rate of 14 gallons per minute from their spring to a spigot at each home.

Many of our Kichwa colleagues in *Kawsaypak Yaku* (life giving water), come from Miraflores Cochapamba. We are grateful for their partnership in this ministry.

Design work is underway for water systems including more than 1000 homes in the communities of Guantúl, Guayllabamba Santa Rosa, San Bernardo, Santiago de Quito, and Chañag Puelaso. Construction of the Sanancahuan water system resumes pending government approval of the design report. Spring protection begins in Chañag Puelaso and San Bernardo this month.
