On a return trip to the Andean village of Achullay in Ecuador, I was privileged to take in the celebration of this community's water inauguration first-hand. First, we remembered. The community made the kilometerlong trek downhill and then up again to reenact the former way they used to acquire their daily water supply. This time hauling water back up was not necessary. Secondly, we gave thanks. The Achullay people praised God and expressed gratitude to the *Life-Giving Water International* Team for their partnership in this work. Somehow everyone outdid one another in showing honor.

- •In January, Bruce presented a paper on innovative reservoir design for rural areas at the IPWE conference in Sri Lanka, and interacted with Iranian and Moroccan friends we met at previous conferences.
- •Five young Latin American professionals from three countries are preparing for three months through *Corrientes* (a Reach Beyond ministry) to serve as global volunteers in difficult places. Cherith meets weekly with one woman for spiritual mentoring. She also led a seminar on Inner Healing and meets with participants for follow-up.
- •Two weekends this winter Bruce attended a course on water system design given by Ecuadorian government to better understand their requirements.
- •We look forward to receiving and training six interns this summer and fall.

Water Supply Challenges

Life Giving Water International, alongside Kawsay-pak Yaku, helps communities conquer technical and other issues to provide a sustaining supply of potable water. This requires prayer, persistence and perspiration! Santiago de Quito, a group of communities with 400 families, needs technical help to build internal unity around a strong design so that they can secure materials needed to build their water system.

Sanancahuan Grande, a community of 120 families, needs an economical water system design to obtain limited government funds. Encalado requires technical help and encouragement as they sort through misunderstandings on water rights between communities. Castug Tungurahuilla needs technical assistance to design and install practical chlorine water disinfection. The determination and resourcefulness of these communities and the Lord's faithfulness continue to inspire us.

Together with *Kawsaypak Yaku*, our Ecuadorian partner, we provide follow-up in 20 communities, helping them to model the benefits of improved health and clean water. A steady stream of communities come to our office in Riobamba asking for advice and help for their water systems. It is our pleasure to pray and serve them in Jesus' name.
