## **CLEAN WATER FOR CHRISTMAS**

The 288 families in four **Azama** communities industriously work to complete their water system to enjoy clean water 24/7 by Christmas. This last phase of the project includes building three additional reservoirs and hand-digging 15 miles of 4-foot deep trench to install the distribution pipe to every home so that each family receives clean water.

The community, located about 100 miles north of Quito, receives health & hygiene classes and Bible lessons taught by our team. **Azama** community leaders requested continued

evangelism to compliment the water system work. Our goal is to enable them to improve spiritual and physical health through *Life-Giving Water*.

## **OUR FIELD STAFF - KEY TEAM MEMBERS**

Our dedicated field staff provide essential skills and daily supervision of community labor in each water system project. Their masonry, building, and plumbing skills play a vital role in achieving a successful outcome for each water system. Since the field staff are from rural Quichua speaking communities, their fluency in Spanish and Quichua builds strong relationships in each community. Often, they sacrificially travel long distances to work away from home. We pray that the Lord continues to bless their witness as they express Jesus' love and the gospel message verbally and with their hands.

## ONGOING PROJECTS AND MINISTRY



The *LGWI* Board named Wade Daugherty as board chairman. Wade and his wife Sarah serve as LGWI board members since its founding in 2015.

- The community of Santiago de Quito finished building their pumped water system. As soon as the power company provides electrical service the pumps can be tested and they can begin using the water system.
- The LGWI team designed the Guayllabamba community water system to serve 200 homes. We plan to begin implementation in early 2023.

- The CODEINSE team completed the Pull San Jose water system design and presented it to the community in October. We plan to begin construction in February of 2023.
- Ryan DeGroot returned to Ecuador for his third stint
  of volunteer service with the *CODEINSE* team. Ryan
  worked two weeks this fall, reviewing and finalizing the
  Santiago de Quito distribution system plans to give to
  the community.
- LGWI staff is consulting with the New Jersey Institute of Technology—Engineers Without Borders student chapter to facilitate the design of the Maca Grande community water system. EWB is raising funds for the project.
